# 1 Executive Summary

The Kurdistan Region has been undergoing a turbulent period over the past five years, facing a combination of crisis such as a war with ISIS, influx of large refugee and IDP populations and a financial crisis. The trifecta of war, humanitarian emergency and financial crisis has severely affected the region, its population, service and infrastructure and caused a regress on its development goals across all sectors, particularly health and education. As an important period of recovery is about to begin, it is crucial for the region and its partners to quickly and effectively implement priority recovery and resilience building projects to improve the welfare and living conditions of the population, create conditions for stability and cohesion and strengthen public rest.

This document, presents a detailed breakdown of a total number of 167 priority humanitarian Small Scale Projects (SMPs) for 2019. The focus is therefore on small-scale projects with the cost per project ranging from USD 28,000 to 1.2 million. The information in this document is presented in tables by governorate and sector and includes project type, location, number of beneficiaries, and costing estimation.
